**PES Officer 1:** Have you got a permit?

**Driver:** Oh, no

**PES Officer 1:** Right, unfortunately this is a resident permit bay, you need to move your vehicle further down.

**Adam:** You might think you know you're parking closer to the school for your child's safety but then you've got to think about when you're gone and somebody else is doing it and your child is coming out. Is your child going to be the one who steps out behind that parked car? That's where children's lives potentially are on the line.

**Driver:** Are you alright?

**PES Officer 2:** Yes, I'm fine thanks. You're in a resident's bay.

**Sarah:** We're worried that someone is going to get seriously hurt really soon. It's so dangerous; it's a big problem for the school.

**PES Officer 3:** What we like to do is take pictures of the front and rear of the car, also a picture trying to get the signage in the background as well.

**Adam:** Since April 2016, we've issued over 15,000 tickets. Our officers patrol outside schools morning and afternoon. We've conducted 183 school visits last calendar year. We get a lot of photos of vehicles parking in ways they shouldn't be doing.

**Paul:** Being out here on my day to day role I've actually seen two cars both at different times actually reverse over a child and a parent through poor parking. All the children who come to school deserve to be safe and so do the parents. If you're parking on the pavement which is a safe area for a child to walk, you're risking not only the life of the child but the life of the parent in a possible accident.
